## CAGLE ANNOUNCES 15 MILLION IN CAREER ACADEMY GRANTS

Lieutenant Governor Cagle is proud to announce that the Technical College System of Georgia will for the third year begin to solicit grant applications for 15 million dollars of bond funding for Career Academy grants in FY10. Schools, businesses, and community leaders are encouraged to come together and apply for a Career Academy in their area.

Over the last two years, these grants have been instrumental in expanding the number of Career Academies statewide. Since 2006, 13 communities have received much needed start-up and equipment funding. Today we have 16 career academies that, through a charter, are providing spe-

cialized career pathways and increased relevance in their coursework for Georgia's high school students.

As in previous years, the TCSG will manage the Solicitation of Grants and will also handle the distribution of funds to the award recipients. To assist in preparing for the grants, the TCSG will be holding two Career Academy Grant Application Workshops, one in south Georgia and one in north Georgia. These grant application workshops will provide information about the Charter application process, as well as answer questions about accounting for grant funds. The training sessions are :

June 23 - Tifton Campus of Moultrie Tech.

June 25 – TCSG office in Atlanta.

Both workshops will begin around 9:00 AM and conclude around noon.
